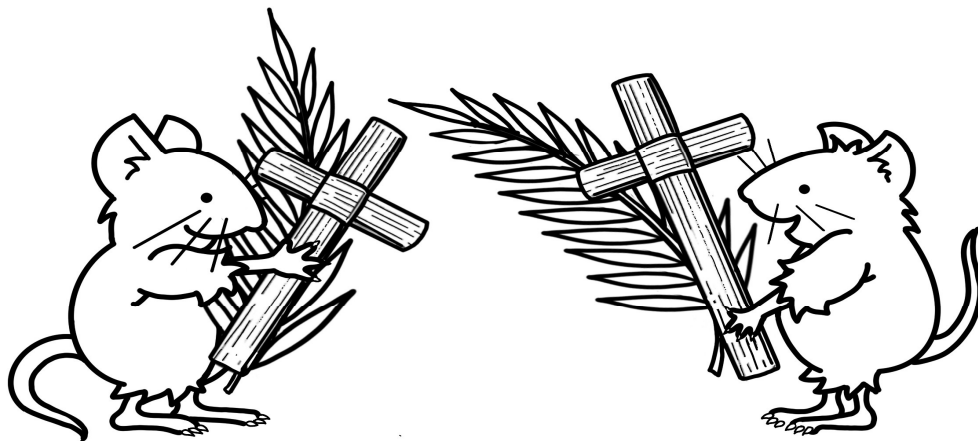

The only trouble with summer is that people start telling you how many days it is until Christmas! It will come only too quickly! By the time you read this we will be well into Lent. I wonder whether you decided to give something up for Lent. I wonder whether you have managed to stick to your decision. At New Year I heard Kathryn Jenkins and Aled Jones discussing New Year Resolutions. They agreed they had stopped making them because they always forgot them within a couple of days. Is that how we feel about Lenten resolutions?

I prefer to try and take up something rather than give something up. There are so many things to choose from. But now is the time when we get our examples from spring. Kemble Church, Eco Church

Kemble Church is part of a scheme called Eco Church, a project from A Rocha UK, which helps churches to care for God's creation through their: worship and teaching; use of buildings; use of land; engagement with the community and individual lifestyles.

Once again, the abundance of snowdrops, crocuses, aconites and daffodils in our churchyards, green spaces and gardens has reminded us that January and February are not bleak months to be endured, but rather that there is plenty going on under the soil, and the promise of so much more to come with the start of spring on 20th March.



There are now three bird boxes in the churchyard and three more in the Community gardens ready to host their first residents.

In the garden, March is the month of feeding, dividing, and sowing: getting the soil ready, perhaps with some lovely homemade compost; dividing perennial plants; and sowing seeds, remembering to include varieties that will attract bees and butterflies. If you have bird feeders, keep feeding the birds. If you have space for it, this is a good time to put in a small pond, one of the best things we can do for wildlife in our gardens. The grass is starting to grow, but if it is cut too frequently or too short, it won't be supporting much wildlife – you could consider letting it grow longer, or even set aside an area as a mini wildflower meadow.

Here are some other ways we can join in:

3 March: World Wildlife Day - a United Nations International day to celebrate all the world's wild animals and plants and the contribution that they make to our lives and the health of the planet.

11 March to 17 March: Compost Week - prepare to turn waste into wonder!

11 March to 17 March is also the Big Plastic Count – 12 billion pieces of plastic waste are thrown away in the UK every week. You can join in the campaign by counting every piece of plastic waste that you use in a week and reporting back at www.thebigplasticcount.com.

15 March to 31 March: The Great British Spring Clean - Keep Britain Tidy's annual national clean-up.

22 March: World Water Day - to encourage changing the way we use, consume and manage water in our lives.

23 March Earth Hour – switch off the lights for an hour at 8.30pm. For more information visit www.earthhour.org

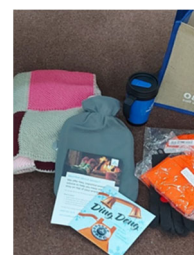
Kemble and Ewen Craft Group need donations of knitting wool please.

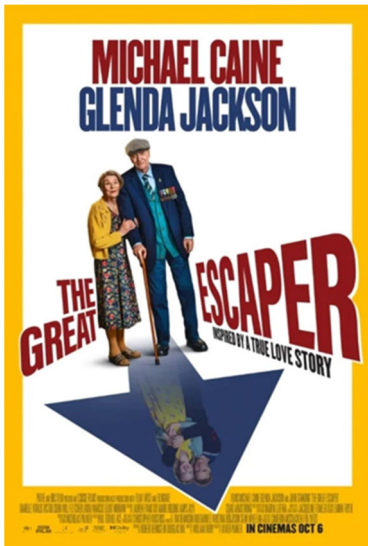

Farming Matters

Although there are some serious conflicts occurring in various parts of the world at the moment, devastating the lives of those involved, there is a more subtle battle going on closer to home, for our countryside. Various government environmental schemes, the desire for more housing and the financial attraction of renewable energy are all competing for land which would otherwise be growing essential and often low environmental impact food.

We saw the impact that French farmers' protests have had on the transport network in France, but the lower profile wrath felt by Welsh farmers has not yet reached this level of disruption. Last week 3000 farmers gathered in Carmarthen Market to show their 'dissatisfaction' with the proposed Welsh Sustainable Farming Scheme (SFS).

Although this Scheme is voluntary, it is planned to be the replacement source of income for the Common Agricultural Policy's Basic Payment Scheme (BPS), which provided payments to EU farmers enabling them to continue to produce food even when it was uneconomic to do so. Recent data from Aberystwyth University showed the average profit for Welsh farms was £158/hectare, including the BPS payment of £243/hectare, meaning that the average farm would be losing £85/hectare without the BPS payment. So, some form of subsidy is essential to keep the farmers doing what they do.

The main cause for concern appears to be the requirement within the Scheme to plant 10% of all farms with trees and set aside 10% of land for wildlife habitat. Now this sounds wonderful for carbon sequestration and environmental habitats but if 20% less land is farmed there will be a significant impact on food production.

Meanwhile, in England, the new buzzwords are Biodiversity Net Gain. It is now a statutory requirement, enabled by the Environment Act 2021, for all developments (anything requiring planning permission except small, self-build projects) to replace any biodiversity lost due to development, with at least 110% of what was existing before the development started. Large infrastructure and marine projects will be added in November 2025.



This effectively means that whatever biodiversity existed on a site must be recreated, + 10%, within the site or elsewhere, preferably locally. Again, this is good news for our wildlife species, including invertebrates, insects, pollinators and large and small mammals as well as potential vegetation to remove carbon from the atmosphere. But it also effectively means that each development could potentially remove twice its area from farmed land.

Brownfield sites are not exempt as they often provide valuable habitats for wildlife. Following a Baseline Score calculated by using the Environment Agency's Biodiversity Metric Tool, the required 'additionality' is determined, which must be provided at another site. Farmers and landowners are able to set aside their land by creating Environmental Habitat areas which in turn creates Biodiversity Units, which can be sold to developers to satisfy their 110% replacement requirement.

A recent example saw a 7 hectare site create 20 Biodiversity Units which were sold for £30,000 per unit. That's an income of £85,714 per hectare. The farmer (or his heirs) must commit to maintaining the habitats for 30 years which would deliver him £2,857/hectare/year. Compare this to the annual loss of £85 per hectare experienced by the average Welsh farmer for producing food.



Solar farms can also be very lucrative. Although set-up costs are high, around £150,000/hectare, income generation is significant at around £60,000/hectare per year. This is an attractive return on investment and significantly more than using the land to produce food.

All these pressures, and opportunities, are causing farmers and landowners to think about their future sources of income. If government policies and societal pressures result in environmental habitats, climate change mitigation and renewable energy being prioritised, food production will suffer. The result could be more intensification of farming and/or sourcing our food from elsewhere in the world where environmental concerns allow farming to displace existing wildlife habitats and carbon storage. We're just moving biodiversity around the planet!

We all need to ensure there is a balance between nature and food production. One solution could be the emergence of a new trend – Agrivoltaic farming – the practice of installing solar panels on stilts allowing the land underneath to still be farmed.

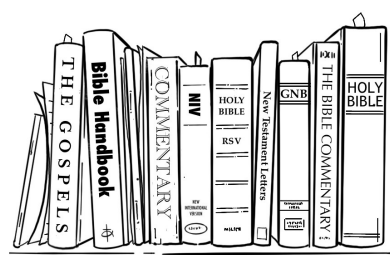
